An internship at Winchester Social Services can offer you:

- A meaningful experience and preparation to work in Child Protective Services, Foster Care and Adoption, and/or Adult Protective Services
- Integration of classroom learning with direct practice
- Hands-on experience in the field and office setting
- The opportunity to work alongside an outstanding team of professionals
- The potential for full-time employment following completion of your internship

An internship at Winchester Social Services cannot offer:

- Volunteer Work Winchester Social Services only accepts internship placements through accredited colleges and universities. We do not accept volunteer placements due to the sensitive nature of our work.
- A "caseload" Winchester Social Services does not assign interns primary assignment to assessments, investigations, or cases. You will have the opportunity to work closely with our Family Services Specialists as they go about their work.
- Clinical hours Your internship hours at Winchester Social Services will not count toward clinical hours.

FAQS

How do I apply for an internship at Winchester Social Services?

The first step in the process is to complete an application. Apply now.

How soon should I apply?

Interested students should apply at least two months, and at a minimum, one month before the semester starts. Your internship cannot begin until all necessary background checks are completed.

What kinds of things will I be doing in my internship?

You will observe, shadow and assist our trained Family Services Specialist working in Child Protective Services, Foster Care and Adoption and Adult Protective Services. You will experience a variety of casework activities. You will learn about agency data systems and documentation.

What are the requirements for my internship?

You will be required to complete a Criminal Background Check and a Child Protective Services history check. We only accept internships through accredited colleges and universities. Internships must be related to your required course of study and you must be covered under your college or university's liability policies.

Will my internship be paid?

Generally, internships at Winchester Social Services are unpaid internships.

Is there a minimum number of internship hours required?

Yes, Winchester Social Services requires students to complete a minimum of 120 hours.

What day/hours are available?

Winchester Social Services business hours are Monday-Friday, 8:30 am-4:30 pm. Most internship-related activities will occur during these days and hours.

Is there an age requirement?

Interns are required to be eighteen years of age or older.

Are there skill requirements?

Our most successful interns possess the following skills:

- Strong communication and interpersonal skills
- Ability to work with a diverse population
- Ability to work independently
- Good reading and writing skills
- Ability to handle confidential and sensitive information
- Ability to work in a fast-paced environment

Will I receive an interview for a potential placement?

Yes, it is important that you assess if an internship placement at Winchester Social Services is the right fit for you. We must also assess that you are a right fit for our organization. A meeting is a great opportunity for us to get to know each other.
