Old County Courthouse – 20 N. Loudoun Street

This historic building built in the 1840's as the Frederick County Court House now houses the Shenandoah Valley Civil War Museum. During the Civil War it served as a prison, hospital, and barracks for Northern and Southern soldiers. Soldiers wrote their names and drew pictures on the walls, some of which can still be seen. Who was elected to political office for the first time at this location in 1758?

Admiral Byrd Statue – Winchester-Frederick County Joint Judicial Center (5 N. Kent Street). Statue is located outside the West entrance, facing Cameron St. Admiral Richard Evelyn Byrd naval officer and medal of honor recipient was born in Winchester and went on to be a great explorer, commanding five expeditions to the Antarctic. How many miles of Antarctic territory did he map? **Answer:**



Daniel Morgan Statue – 304 E. Piccadilly Street

Brigadier General Daniel Morgan was an American pioneer, soldier, and politician who lived in Winchester, VA. Participating in numerous conflicts including the Revolutionary War and the Whiskey Rebellion. What quote is written on the base of the Daniel Morgan Statue? **Answer:**



Patsy Cline Mural – 125 S. Loudoun Street on the North Side of the building in the back off Indian Alley
Patsy Cline, an American country music singer in the 1950's and 1960's with popular crossover hits who proudly noted she was from Winchester, VA. She died at the age of 30 in the crash of a private airplane
In the mural a Beauty Shop is identified in the picture. What is the name of the beauty shop?

George Washington Office Museum – 32 W. Cork Street (Corner of Cork and Braddock St.)

George Washington used this little log building as a military office from September 1755 to December of 1756 while Fort Loudoun was being constructed at the north end of town during the French and Indian War. OTW Splash Pad – 113 South Loudoun Street

A new feature added to Old Town in 2013, the Splash Pad is a popular place for family and friends to gather and enjoy cooling off on hot days. Each fountain is illuminated at night. How many individual water fountains make up this Splash Pad? **Answer:**



Tomb of Lord Fairfax – 114 W. Boscawen Street

Thomas Fairfax, 6th Lord Fairfax of Cameron who owned the land in this area and hired a young George Washington to survey it died December 9, 1781 and was laid to rest in Winchester. While the tomb at 114 W. Boscawen Street is his final resting place, it was not his first. Where was he originally buried?

Mount Hebron Cemetery – 305 E. Boscawen Street

Mount Hebron Cemetery burial place of war hero Brigadier General Daniel Morgan is a complex of four adjoining burying grounds embraced within a common enclosure. When was the oldest cemetery within Mount Hebron Cemetery established? **Answer:**



Handley Library – 100 West Piccadilly St.

The library building built in the Beaux-Arts style representing an open book was made possible from a gift by Scranton Judge John Handley who visited but never lived in Winchester. When was the library dedicated (full date)? **Answer:**



Handley Library – 100 West Piccadilly St. (behind the library on West Fairfax St.)


