Recycle Winchester!

Remember these four simple things:
REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE
and RESPECT.



Recycling is easy in Winchester!

Bottles, aluminum cans, steel and tin cans, aluminum foil, plastic and glass bottles go in the blue recycling bin.

Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office paper, junk mail, phonebooks, paperboard (cereal boxes, etc.) and cardboard.

Tips to remember:

- When in doubt, leave it out.
- Recycling incorrectly can do more harm than good.
- Recycling correctly makes all the difference in the world.
- Always rinse bottles, cans, jars, etc.
- Keep paper products separate.



 Recycling saves valuable landfill space.

 Recycling conserves natural resources.


 Recycling saves energy.

The Recycle Symbol



Products with this symbol may be recycled in your home town.



Did You Know...

Many items can be recycled. Don't toss these items in the trash. Recycle instead!

Items to recycle...	What to do...
Aluminum cans	Rinse.
Steel cans	Rinse.
Paper bags, newspaper & glossy advertising inserts	Place in bin or tie.
Green, brown & clear glass	Remove lids and rinse.
Plastic soft drink bottles & milk jugs	Remove lids and rinse.
Other plastics	Put all plastics #1-7 (except styrofoam) in your recycle bin: plastic flower pots, buckets, tubs, pails, reusable plastic containers & lids, bags, and films.
Corrugated cardboard	Flatten, tie or contain.






Which Ones to Recycle?


Many of these items can be recycled. Which ones can be recycled in your community?





Buy Recycled!

You can reduce the amount of waste going into landfills and help protect the environment by doing some simple things.

-  Buy school supplies made from recycled materials. Backpacks and rulers are made from recycled plastic. Pencils and paper are made from recycled newspaper and cardboard. What items do you use at school made from recycled materials?
-  Take your own canvas bag when you go shopping instead of using a paper or plastic bag.
-  If you buy one or two things, tell the cashier you don't need a bag.
-  Buy batteries that can be recharged.
-  Buy products packaged in recyclable containers.
-  Buy economy-sized products rather than smaller ones.





Recycled Materials

Recycled materials are used to make all kinds of things. Look below to see what is made from the things you recycle.



Recycled items:	Things that are made:
Steel	Bikes, nails, cars & other things
Glass	Jars, tiles & other things
Plastic	Soda bottles, tables, carpet, shoes, clothes & other things
Newspaper & cardboard	Pens, pencils, paper, cereal boxes & other things



Recycle Used Tires!

Old used tires can be recycled into many different things.
A few of them are listed below.

-  Bulletin boards
-  Floor mats
-  Playground mulch
-  Soaker hoses
-  Shoe soles



Reuse Tires, Too!

You also can reuse old tires as
playground equipment!

Composting: Nature's Way to Recycle

You can recycle organic materials (fruit and vegetable peels, food scraps, lawn clippings, leaves, etc.) in your own composting bin! In a few months, you can use the compost as fertilizer to help plants grow.




Become a Green Rider!

Take good care of your car. Proper maintenance, like changing your oil regularly, helps your car last longer and reduces air pollution. Recycle your used motor oil.





Old household appliances can be recycled, too.





Recycling Reduces Litter!

Which items below can be recycled? Draw a line from the correct items to the recycling bin.




Recycle Single-Serve Soft Drink Bottles!


Protect Winchester's Environment!


Celebrate Earth Day!
